Subject	UK ETA & eVisa requirements		

What?

- The UK Government is committed to strengthening the UK's borders by ensuring everyone travelling to the UK (except British and Irish citizens) has advance permission to travel – our Universal Permission to Travel (UPT) requirement.
- Supporting the digital vision, the Home Office is moving from physical immigration documents to digital-only immigration products.
- Phasing out physical visas and immigration permissions and introducing eVisas and ETAs.

Aim?

- To streamline travel processes.
- To improve border security.
- To introduce innovative technology.
- To ensure smoother journeys for all individuals travelling to the UK.

Who?

 All individuals entering the UK (except British and Irish citizens) will need advance permission.

How?

- Visa nationals and those already granted permission to enter or remain should obtain an eVisa (These individuals may also have physical proof which they can use as evidence for travel).
- Individuals who do not need a visa, entry clearance or other specified immigration status will need an ETA to travel to the UK and they should obtain this before they travel.

eVisa

• What it is: An online record of immigration permission, in place of a physical document (e.g., visa vignette or Biometric Residence Permit or Biometric Residence Card).



- Who needs it: To view the list of nationalities requiring entry clearance prior to travel to the UK please follow the link: Visa national list – Guidance: <u>UK visa requirements (accessible version) - GOV.UK</u>
- **Permission to travel check:** A "Valid Permission to Travel" response will be returned via sPCR on journeys to the UK for individuals who hold a valid entry clearance.
- **Physical Proof:** Individuals with valid visas or physical documents can still use these as evidence for travel.
- Digital proof: Individuals must create a UKVI account to access their eVisa, and carriers can check eVisa permissions using the "View and Prove" service. This involves the passenger generating a share code and providing this to the carrier to conduct a secure, online check at: https://www.gov.uk/check-immigration-status
- Individuals with newly issued passports: must update their passport details in their UKVI account using the 'Update My Details' service.

Electronic Travel Authorisation (ETA)

- What it is: A digital permission to travel to the UK, valid for two years or until the passport expires (whichever is sooner). It allows multiple entries during the validity period.
- Who needs it: Eligible nationals traveling to the UK if they don't already hold an entry clearance (see eVisa for further information regarding entry clearance)
- **Permission to travel check:** A "Valid Permission to Travel" response will be returned via sPCR on journeys to the UK for individuals who hold a valid ETA.

ETA pre-enforcement period

During the phased rollout of ETAs and the subsequent pre-enforcement period, visitors from countries whose citizens currently do not require a visa for short-term visits will still be permitted to travel to the UK even if they do not hold an ETA and must not be refused carriage on this basis.

Skippers, operators and agents will **not** be liable for a penalty charge related to ETA checks (permission to travel), and **individuals will not be refused at the border solely for failure to hold an ETA**.

Passport/Travel Documents: Please note that you must continue to check that all individuals have a valid, genuine, passport or travel document and that they are the rightful holder.

Support and Assistance: The UK Border Force Carrier Support Hub is a **24/7 support function** within the Home Office.
